MNPHARM was incorporated as one of the first PBC's in Minnesota on January 2, 2015 by Founders Jeff Reinert and Dave Roeser. MNPHARM is a Specific Benefit Corporation (SBC).

We are in the business of Molecular Farming to advance plant-based medicine to Address Significant Public Health Challenges.

Highlight of the Year:

MNPHARM started and achieved several milestones in 2018. Here are some of the important bullet points from this year that will be followed up with briefs in this newsletter.

- cGMP (Current Good Manufacturing Practices) processes
- New Vectors from the lab
- Expanded services with Lyophilizing and Live Cell Assay capabilities.
- Grant
- Second Investor round

MNPHARM <u>pursued</u> our Specific Benefit purpose stated in our articles of incorporation by the following:

- We spent much of the year optimizing our Vectors to provide higher yields and consistent results. A recent breakthrough has allowed us to finally reach those goals. This gives us a more "plug and play" capability for additional protein production.
- We added a lyophilization instrument to the lab. This allows us to freeze dry a protein and ship it
 according to the customers specifications.
- Added ability to conduct Live Cell Assay studies in our lab.
- Awarded a second Regenerative Medicine Minnesota (RMM) grant for the advancement of BMP2, 6 & 7 with fibronectin (FN). Improvement in osteogenic activity corresponded with each BMP's binding affinity for FN.
- Continued working with 3D printing of connective tissues and bone, where our cost reductions will make these treatments a reality.
- Letters of support (LOS) are important in grant proposals, but also open the doors for future
 customers and Investors. Different than a letter of intent (LOI): demonstrates the need and
 market for our products. Several of the support letters came from research areas who will
 purchase research grade materials from MNPHARM.
- In May, we started the process of becoming cGMP compliant. Good manufacturing practice
 guidelines provide guidance for manufacturing, testing, and quality assurance in order to ensure
 that a manufactured product is safe for human consumption or use.
- Partnered with future customer on a NIH grant proposal

MNPHARM succeeded in achieving our specific benefit goals by:

- Found two distributors for VEGF and will start shipping in 2019
- Two different customers hiring MNPHARM to conduct pilot studies to provide proof of concept in making these specific proteins to specifications faster, safer and more cost effective than the current methods of producing these proteins.
- · We completed the first half of our second round of investment around mid-year.

Barriers that prevented us from fully achieving our specific benefit purpose to the extent we planned in this reporting year were:

 Funding continues to be a barrier for us to scale up as we need additional funds to hire researchers and more advanced equipment to advance our work.
