### Ecotone Analytics GBC Minnesota Annual Benefit Report 2018

This report certifies that the Ecotone Analytics board of Directors has chosen the B-Lab Impact Assessment as the third-party standard for Ecotone Analytics GBC, pursuant to clause (2), item (i). The board has also determined that B-Lab, the organization that has promulgated this third-party standard is indeed independent. The board has approved the report, with regard to the period covered by the report (calendar year 2018).

#### **Ecotone's Creation of a General Public Benefit**

(A) How the corporation has pursued general public benefit:

Mission: Ecotone Analytics GBC is a data analytics company working exclusively with clients who want to measure, manage, and communicate their social or environmental impact.

Vision: Ecotone Analytics GBC is committed to expanding the use of social and environmental metrics in decision making for corporations, government, and non-profits.

(B) The extent to which and the ways in which the corporation has created general public benefit include:

In calendar year 2018, Ecotone Analytics GBC helped create general public benefit through the following projects:

Better Futures Minnesota 501(c)(3), - Northwest Indian Community Development Corporation 503(c), and the University of Minnesota-Duluth's Natural Resources Research Institute (NRRI) - Ongoing work with Better Futures' and NWICDC staffs to collect and analyze data under a grant from the Minnesota Environment and Natural Resources Trust fund (ENRTF), and the Legislative-Citizen Commission on the Management of Resources (LCCMR). The project piloted in 2016 and 2017 was renewed in 2018. Continuing to be centered around the environmental impact of "deconstruction" (the systematic disassembly of a residential house), as an alternative to traditional landfill-based demolition. Ecotone collected and analyzed data and provided the stakeholders with environmental impact reports for all of the jobs under the ongoing program. Ecotone worked with NRRI to do deeper analysis of the air, water, and health effects of the projects. With a further focus on leakage into groundwater from construction waste sent to landfill.

Impact Hub MSP 501(c)(3) - Continued work with leadership team and Board to collect and analyze user data for this social impact-oriented co-working space.

All Square 501(c)(3) - Worked with Founder and staff to update Social Return on Investment (SROI) calculation and define Logic Model based a 6 months of actual program information. Providing All Square with more information to make decisions and better manage the impact of their program.

Alia 501(c)(3) – Conducted a full impact analysis of the SROI of current foster care system. Resulting in multiple presentations of findings to multi-stakeholder groups across Minnesota and the United States. Spuring conversations about how to better support at risk youth and their families. Alia's work to define and implement their "unsystem" is ongoing and now back with an evidence-informed baseline level of care to exceed.

Fairview/HealthEast Foundation - Conducted a full impact analysis of the SROI for two projects they funded in 2018 (Fruits and Veggies RX and Eastside Table). Both were shown to have positive impact on blood glucose, body mass, risk of stroke, and heart disease risk levels for the low income target population. With the evidence-based metrics for success and information about participant drop off risk the staff was better able to manage to ongoing outcomes of the program and attract/retain funders.

Research and development- Continued developing and solidifying measurement and reporting methodologies to better communicate the social and environmental impact for enterprise actions to their stakeholders. Working with the Impact Management Project, a global group of impact reporting practitioners creating a common industry wide standard framework for measuring impact. Using this understanding, Ecotone has advocated for and educated the use of impact measurement methods within the Minnesota Social Enterprise space. Creating a more transparent and accountable standard of impact for all social enterprises and impact investors. As well as hiring two researchers providing career opportunities and work experience for the next generation of impact reporting workforce.

(C) Any circumstances that hindered efforts to pursue or create general public benefit?

Social and environmental impact measurement and due diligence for impact investment continues to emerge as a structural piece of impact generally but remains in the early adopter stage of growth. Due to this continued slow adoption of the industry, we are still testing market fit and pricing models. Though we've now moved to building a pipeline of projects as opposed to product development. As more case studies and general awareness of social impact measurement permeates the business culture at large, we see an opportunity to help funders and organizations make better impact choices with their money.
