Pursued Public Benefit:

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- In Article III of InnovateK12's Articles of Incorporation, it states that InnovateK12 "shall be organized and operated for general business purposes. In addition, this corporation shall be a Special Benefit Corporation organized and operated to pursue the following specific public benefit purpose: to support schools and school districts interested in improving learning environments and employee/community engagement through crowd-based innovation software, design thinking, and lean startup strategies."
- InnovateK12's mission is to serve educators and educational organizations with the tools for innovation used in successful business environments. Unfortunately, these tools are typically unavailable due to their high cost and the required bandwidth associated with execution. Through the development of a powerful learning network of innovative leaders and through the availability of volume discount pricing, InnovateK12 is able to make this toolkit available as a specific public benefit.

Progress Toward Pursued Public Benefit:

- In 2018, InnovateK12 secured the services of Nilan Johnson Lewis's Zachary Crain to assist with the filing of all required documents in support of the above-stated public benefit to support all interested schools and school districts in growing a culture of innovation based on the toolkit developed by InnovateK12 and described in our Articles of Incorporation.
- The impact of this effort grew significantly in 2018, expanding from eight school districts (Austin, Becker, Cambridge-Isanti, Eden Prairie, Mahtomedi, Minnetonka, Orono, and Stillwater) to include nearly 30 districts in nine different states. The size of the network will expand again in 2019, reaching as many as 50 different educational organizations in nearly twenty states.
- InnovateK12 hosted a successful K12 Innovation Summit in July 2018, bringing together over 130 educators from across the country to learn more about the innovation toolkit and to share promising practices. The network continued to meet monthly during the 2018-19 school year, and members shared their progress within the network and publicly on social media channels. By all estimates, the launch of the company was a success and continues to grow in its impact. My role as CEO is to work collaboratively with members of the network to ensure that the toolkit is having the desired impact and that the network is healthy.

Hindrances Impacting the Pursued Public Benefit:

• There are no employees of InnovateK12 and the organization operates based on the efforts of its network. Members of the network provide services that are compensated through independent contracts on an asneeded basis. All members of the network pay an annual membership fee to support the ongoing efforts. Although there are many challenges associated with operating such a lean organization, this has allowed InnovateK12 to maintain low overhead and therefore continue to make the toolkit and member experience available at a small fraction of the typical market cost.
