3 (1) i ii iii and (2): Since launching product in November 2018 the board has not yet selected an independent third-party standard against which ClipDifferent has pursued general public benefit. This is part of ClipDifferent's business plan for the second quarter of this year.

3 (2) The standard, as stated in ClipDifferent's articles is: to perform services in connection with people who have limited hand dexterity as a result of various physical or neurological disabilities, visual impairments, limb differences or complications from serving in the armed forces; to empower them by making products which make their lives easier by maintaining or increasing their ability to perform the simple self-care task of fingernail clipping.

3 (2) A B C: In the five months of manufacturing product, ClipDifferent was able to not only sell hundreds of ClipDifferent Pros, but has facilitated a 10 unit donation to Courage Kenny Rehabilitation Institute and also adapted individual units for specific use by a person with Dwarfism, and elderly customers with thicker fingernails. ClipDifferent Pros have been donated to communities who support limb loss/limb difference for adults and children: Born Just Right, Lucky Fin, Muscular Dystrophy Association, Illinois Assistive Tech Program —upwards of 30 units. In addition ClipDifferent, GBC has given units to persons with vision loss/ blindness, veterans and has partnered with Multiple Sclerosis Society, Arthritis Foundation, and the Amputee Coalition to become a resource for their members who have issues with independent self-care. This is all in keeping with ClipDifferent's purpose as stated above.

At the end of August 2018, ClipDifferent amended its articles to become a General Benefit Corporation without setting up an independent 3rd party standard.

ClipDifferent has and will continue to impact the disabilities markets defined by the articles listed above and become compliant with what is necessary to maintain its public benefit status.
