- ★ **Science and Civics Guide:** This resource is specifically focused on reaching STEM students and meeting them where they are, we hope to continue to shift the culture of the scientific community towards more, deeper, civic engagement.
- ★ **Election Official and Campus Engagement Report & Toolkit:** In partnership with the ALL IN Campus Democracy challenge, we conducted a survey to campuses and local elections officials to find the best ways they can work together to effectively engage student voters.
