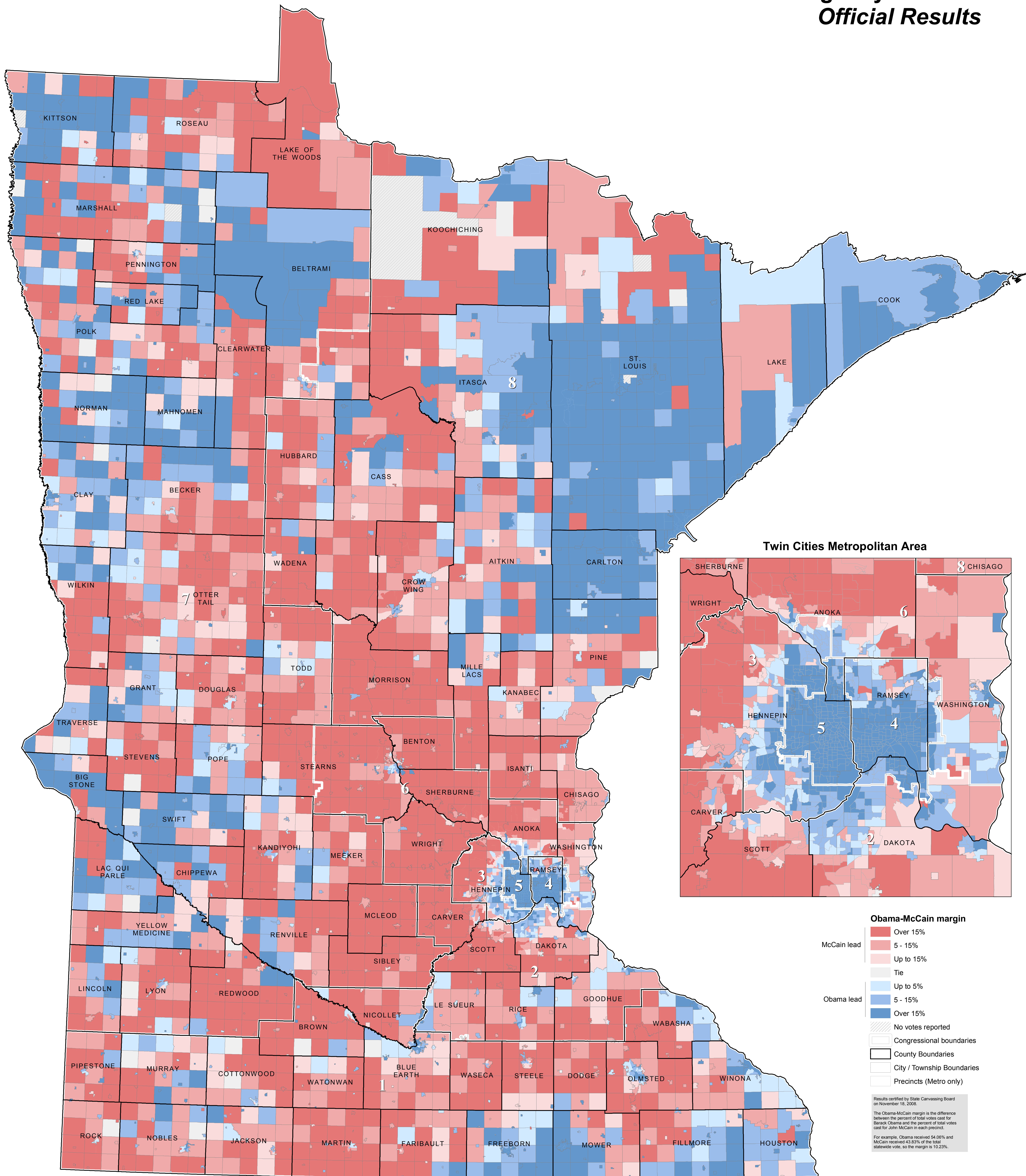

Official Results



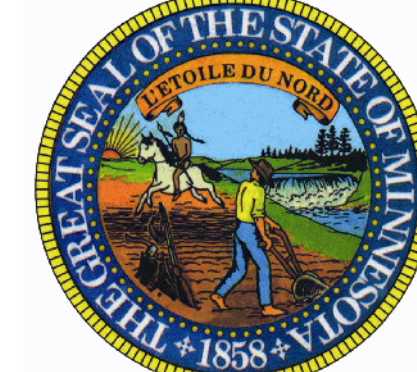
Twin Cities Metropolitan Area

Obama-McCain margin

- Over 15% (Dark Red)
- 5 - 15% (Light Red)
- Up to 15% (Very Light Red)
- Tie (White)
- Up to 5% (Very Light Blue)
- 5 - 15% (Light Blue)
- Over 15% (Dark Blue)
- No votes reported (White with diagonal lines)
- Congressional boundaries (Dashed line)
- County Boundaries (Solid line)
- City / Township Boundaries (Thin solid line)
- Precincts (Metro only) (Thin solid line)

Results certified by State Canvassing Board on November 19, 2008.
 The Obama-McCain margin is the difference between the percent of total votes cast for Barack Obama and the percent of total votes cast for John McCain in each precinct.
 For example: Obama received 54.08% and McCain received 43.83% of the total statewide vote, so the margin is 10.25%.
