

Each petition page must have a short title describing the purpose of the petition. M.R. 8205.1010, subp. 2(C)

The language on the petition must be printed in no smaller than 10-point type. M.R. 8205.1010, subp. 2(B)

“Each petition page must have a signer’s oath in no smaller than 12 – point bold type. M.R. 8205.1010, subp. 2(F)

“...each separate page that is part of the petition shall include an oath in the following form: **“I solemnly swear (or affirm) that I know the contents and purpose of this petition, that I do not intend to vote at the primary election for the office for which this nominating petition is made, and that I signed this petition of my own free will.”...**” M.S. 204B.07, subd. 4

The signer’s oath and the signature lines must be on the same side of the paper. M.R. 8205.1010, subp. 2(A)

We, the undersigned eligible voters, residing in the election district for the office set forth below, hereby nominate by petition _____ who resides at _____ (name of candidate) and who represents the _____ (political party or principle, in no more than three words) for the office of _____ (residence address, including street and number, if any) to be voted on at the general election to be held on November 3, 2026. We understand that it is also intended that this petition will be presented by the above named candidate in place of the filing fee, as provided by *Minnesota Statutes*, section 204B.11, subdivision 2

“Each petition page must have a statement summarizing the purpose of the petition.” M.R. 8205.1010, subp. 2(D)

“...A nominating petition filed pursuant to section 204B.07 is effective as a petition in place of a filing fee if the nominating petition includes a prominent statement informing the signers of the petition that it will be used for that purpose...” M.S. 204B.11, subd. 2

“Each petition page must include the following statement immediately above the signature lines: **“All information must be filled in by person(s) signing the petition unless disability prevents the person(s) from doing so.”...**” MR. 8205.1010, subp. 2(G)

“Each petition page must have no more than ten signature lines. The signature lines must be consecutively numbered. Each signature line must have space for the date of signature; a signature; and each signatory’s year of birth; printed first, middle, and last name; and residence address, municipality, and county.” M.R. 8205.1010, subp. 2(H)

Nominating petitions must be signed during the filing period of May 19, 2026, to June 2, 2026. The number of signatures required on a nominating petition are as follows:
(1) For U.S. Senate and state office voted on statewide – 2,000
(2) For a congressional office – 1,000
(3) For a legislative office – 500
M.S. 204B.08

“A nominating petition may consist of one or more separate pages each of which shall state:
(a) the office sought
(b) the candidate’s name and residence address, including street and number if any; and
(c) the candidates political party or political principal expressed in not more than three words...”
M.S. 204B.07, subd. 1

“Petition in place of filing fee. At the time of filing an affidavit of candidacy, a candidate may present a petition in place of the filing fee. The petition may be signed by any individual eligible to vote for the candidate...” M.S. §204B.11, subd. 2

This petition cannot be prepared on paper larger than 8 ½ inches wide by 14 inches long. M.R. 8205.1010, subp. 2(A)

“Each petition page must include the following statement **“All information on this petition is subject to public inspection...”**” M.R. 8205.1010, subp. 2(I)
