Annual benefit report for CD3 General Benefit Corporation Time Period: Calendar year 2016- assessment 2:1.17

This is the first report delivered for filing by the general benefit corporation. The Board of Directors agreed to use a third party verification system of the B Impact Assessment and conducted its first assessment on 2.1.17 for the calendar year 2016. Pursuant to a general benefit corporation, CD3's Board of Directors adopted the following mission and vision as the standard to which it operates:

Mission Statement:

To develop technologies that empowers people to reduce the spread of aquatic invasive species and safeguard local economics and the natural environment.

Company VISION:

Lead innovation of technologies that employ best in class behavioral and scientific solutions to prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species.

Pursued Public Benefit: CD3 General Benefit Corporation is currently in the research and design phase of developing a boat cleaning station. CD3 Stations empower boaters with the tools to employ the best management practices of cleaning, draining, drying and disposing of bait. These stations are designed to protect the environment by reducing the risk of spreading aquatic invasive species and thereby also safeguarding local economies.

Additionally, based upon both the company's mission and vision, the board of directors identified a non-profit recipient for future donations of 10% percentage of net yearly profits. This non-profit is a leader in the field of education and outreach to boaters on the threats of aquatic invasive species.

Hindered Public Benefit: As a small corporation of two part time staff, we find ourselves lacking capacity to improve some of the metrics outlined by the B Impact Assessment. However, as our company grows, we hope to be able to tackle these challenges in the future.
