

MNPHARM <u>pursued</u> our Specific Benefit purpose stated in our articles of incorporation by the following:

- Business activities: Secured the worldwide rights to the best in class Vector for infiltration of tobacco plants.
- Acquired and/or made equipment and set up growing facility and lab.
- Developed a "Mother Room" to grow our own seed stock.
- Found the 3101 agrobacterium that had eluded us for over a year and have developed back up measures to keep a backup supply when needed.
- Started conservations with several different researchers who will be the customers for our products.
- We discovered that we can grow product in even less space and believe our cost at this stage is half the cost of others on the market.

MNPHARM succeeded in achieving our specific benefit goals by:

- We continue to work with The Mayo Clinic weekly and have expanded the collaboration into the field of Nano bodies for cancer.
- We have started our own seed stock and produce more than ample supplies of seed.
- We have identified several medical treatments we can manufacture that will address significant health issues. In 2017 we will be producing VEGF and BMP for researchers.

Barriers that prevented us from fully achieving our specific benefit purpose to the extend we planned in this reporting years were:

- Our freezer with all our agrobacterium died in July. This had a negative impact on experimentation results. We have budgeted for a -80 freezer and a backup freezer with monitoring tied to smart phones. Poor quality, secondhand equipment slowed our procress.
- Acquiring seeds, agrobacterium and our Vector with inserted molecules has been slow. To
 resolve these issues, we started growing our own seed, acquired the best agrobacterium for
 tobacco infiltration and made redundant vials that are stored in several different locations.
- We found that with all our careful work, we still had processing heat destroying the desired proteins. We have budgeted for two refrigerated centrifuges.
- We applied for one grant, but was not successful.

This report covers the period of time from January 1, 2016 to December 31, 2016.

History:

MNPHARM was incorporated as one of the first PBC's in Minnesota on January 2, 2015 by Founders Jeff Reinert and Dave Roeser. MNPHARM is a Specific Benefit Corporation (SBC).

We are in the business of Molecular Farming to advance plant based medicine to Address Significant Public Health Challenges.

Management:

- o Dave Roeser, Co-Founder & CEO/35+ Years in Business
 - Accounting, finance, agriculture, R&D, built and sold several businesses
- o Jeff Reinert, Co-Founder & President/ 30+ Years in Business
 - Prod Dev, Manufacturing, Operations, Consulting, built and sold several businesses
- o Bryan Roeser CSO / 6+ Years in Business Science
 - Agriculture, R&D and degree in microbial genetics. Research lab & grant experience.

Highlight of the Year:

In June we secured the worldwide rights to the best in class Vector for the infiltration of tobacco plants for the production of nanobody proteins. This allows higher expression of proteins in plants for improved extraction and the ability to grow more in less space.

We started the fund raising process late in the year with a kick off for funding in the first quarter of 2017 using Convertible Debt.

In November we found our new home for MNPHARM. Through the Medical Alley Association we found the Incubology Center at the Discovery Building of the previous Imation Campus. Labs and work space geared for startup companies in the bio-med field. There are many services that we need that are all inclusive, and we may have found our first distributor of products.

The availability of the Incubology impacted the plans for the Maplewood location. Instead of spending on infrastructure to build a FDA approved lab at Maplewood, we realized we needed less funding and could direct funds toward better equipment and human capital to develop our process from small lab to full commercialization. We believe this new direction will jump start development of our product line.
