Introduction

2020 was a difficult year for everyone. COVID-19 changed life as we know it, including our work lives. The murder of George Floyd and resulting unrest in Minneapolis and across the world brought discussions of race and equity to the forefront but also caused personal anguish for many. Additional factors impacting PDA this year were moving to a new office and experiencing growth in projects and staff. We leaned on our mission and values to help guide us through the uncertain times. Throughout the year, we adapted, grew, learned new ways to work together, and found new ways to support our community.

Although 2020 was a challenging year, PDA worked to create positive social impact for our staff, clients, community, and the environment. While we are a small company, the effect of our efforts is far reaching.

Staff

PDA strives to foster an inclusive environment where every individual has the resources and opportunities they need to grow, thrive, and succeed. In 2020, we hired an equity consultant to conduct an equity audit of the company. The audit included interviews and focus groups with staff and an internal document review. The resulting report will provide direction and action steps we can take to become a more equitable, inclusive, and diverse organization. The audit was the first of many steps demonstrating our commitment to social justice.



PDA offers exceptional benefits, a casual and flexible work environment, and professional development opportunities for staff. We also pay all employees at least the living wage for a family. We hired eight new staff members during 2020 and did not need to lay anyone off due to lack of work. We maintained salary and benefit levels throughout the year, including continuing our matching SIMPLE IRA contributions and contributing to staff HSA accounts.

Additionally, we met the challenges of 2020 in a few major ways.

Remote Work

Beginning in March 2020, we allowed all staff to work from home in order to mitigate the risks of COVID-19. To support staff working remotely, we:

 Delivered technology, including monitors, headsets, keyboards, and more to individual's homes, and offered remote tech support.

- Allowed staff to bring home their office chairs, desks, and anything else they needed to create comfortable office space at home.
- Offered fun ways to connect with one another while working remotely, including virtual happy hours, coffee breaks, game playing, and escape rooms.
- ✓ Increased "touch points" like more frequent check-ins from supervisors and HR.
- Onboarded new staff remotely by creating a more robust IT orientation, scheduling virtual meet and greets, and assigning an onboarding buddy.



Pold Leave

The challenges brought on by COVID-19, including school closures, called for more paid leave. PDA responded by informing staff of their options under the Families First Coronavirus Relief Act and assisting them with adjusting their work schedules. While the requirement to provide leave under FFCRA expired on December 31, 2020, we are continuing to offer it to our staff in 2021.

Additionally, we advanced PTO accruals for all staff in April for six months and again in September for four months to ensure everyone had the time off they needed when they needed it. We waived the maximum accrual limits so those who weren't using their PTO would not lose it.

Our staff have thrived despite the challenges related to COVID-19. We lived our value of Excelling Together by supporting, helping, and caring for one another.

Challenge. This year, many conferences were cancelled due to COVID-19. This meant our staff couldn't particle in as many professional development opportunities as they normally would. Many staff shiftparticipated in virtual activities but lost the opportunity to present at conferences and participate in live networking.

Clients

PDA pursues public benefit in Minnesota and across the country by providing program evaluation, statistical consulting, and software development to clients whose programs seek to improve the health and wellbeing of individuals and communities. We work with government agencies, universities, medical institutions, and non-profits to assess and improve their programs. We're committed to delivering objective, high-guality data and innovative, cost-

effective solutions to clients. Our work is focused on tobacco cessation, chronic disease prevention, active transportation, and other public health topics.

We proudly served **18** clients across **9** states in 2020.

- We take care to ensure we only work with clients and on projects that aim to produce or increase public benefit. We will never work with clients who sell tobacco products, participate in gambling, or cause unnecessary harm to the environment.
- ✓ Our evaluations support underserved populations by helping our clients better reach and serve ethnic minorities, low socio-economic status, uninsured, low educated and other groups with their public health programs. We prioritize discussing these populations and the impact of reaching them on client health equity initiatives.
- Our staff partner with clients to publish peer-reviewed articles on public health topics.


Challenge Many of our clients are state health departments and they have had a busy year! Understandably some of our projects were slowed down or paused so the departments could tocus on COVID-19

Community

PDA is an avid supporter of our local community. Each year we strive for impact in the community through volunteerism, company financial donations, staff donation matching, and pro bono work. We support organizations that help our most vulnerable neighbors and advocate for social justice.

In 2020 we supported our community in a few primary ways:

- Sponsored both the Northeast Minneapolis
 Farmer's Market and Neighborhood Roots, the non-profit that operates several farmer's markets in South Minneapolis.
- Donated over 45 games, crafts, and activities to The Link, a non-profit that supports youth in Minneapolis struggling with poverty and homelessness. The games were used in their shelters and given to families at the holidays.



Partnered with other Minnesota B Corporations to raise funds for Every Meal (formerly Sheridan Story), who fights hunger by filling the food gaps children experience on the weekends and in the summer. With so many kids out of school in 2020, the demand on Every Meal was greater than ever. Thirteen of our staff members donated a total of almost \$2,000, which was matched by PDA.

- Matched staff donations to charitable organizations, up to \$200 per person for the year.
- ✓ Gave staff paid time off to bring supplies and help with the cleanup efforts in Minneapolis following the murder of George Floyd.
- Continued two pro bono evaluation projects that started in 2019.
 - House of Charity: We completed a literature review on outcomes and measurement tools for supportive housing programs and created a logic model to assist with data collection and evaluation of their on-site supportive housing program. This project was put on hold part-way through the year due to COVID-19, but we hope to continue it in 2021.
 - Volunteers of America: We continued evaluation work on VOA's pilot aftercare program for youth with co-occurring substance use and mental health disorders. PDA met monthly with the VOA team to design the evaluation and study instruments and adapted the evaluation when COVID disrupted VOA's residential treatment





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Environment

program.

As a Certified B Corporation, we include the environment as one of our stakeholders and make every effort to minimize our impact. In 2020, we continued many of the practices we followed in previous years.

- Carbon neutrality we partner with Native Energy to offset our carbon usage
- Buying only 100% post-consumer recycled paper products
- Paper, glass, cans, plastic, and e-waste recycling



- Using non-disposable dishware
- Supporting restaurants and catering companies that utilize local and sustainable farmers
- Using non-toxic and sustainable cleaning supplies and hand soap
- Offering bus pass reimbursement to staff

Additionally, we installed 100% recycled carpet and eco-friendly flooring in our new office space. Once staff begin using the office, we will offer composting of paper towels, food scraps, and other items.
