




HISTORY OF APEX

Apex Arena Solutions was founded in 2012 as a result of our ownership team growing tired of the way Energy Service Companies delivered renewable energy and energy efficiency projects. Our new business model has changed the way our projects are developed, marketed, and delivered.

Apex Arena Solutions was incorporated as a Minnesota Public Benefit Corporation on January 2, 2015.

Apex's goal is to improve the environment by upgrading the energy efficiency of buildings, reducing both the carbon emissions and pollution that is released to the environment from these facilities. The company also serves the less fortunate by helping alleviate poverty, improving educational opportunities, providing housing and addressing the exploitation of children.

PURSUIT OF OUR WISSION

Regarding the period covered by this report, January 1, 2020 to December 31, 2020, Apex Arena Solutions pursued the specific benefit purpose stated in its articles of incorporation in the following ways.

Apex Arena Solutions, SBC has converted its original role within our company structure and is now solely the holding company for employee salaries and general overhead expenses. This company is no longer pursuing new projects.

We believe that Apex Arena Solutions was successful in achieving the goals of our specific benefit purpose in the following ways.

As the holding company, Apex Arena Solutions is responsible for any costs associated with employees time and labor when they volunteer, which due to Covid restrictions in 2020, was not able to happen.

However, as a Specific Benefit Corporation in MN we strive to alleviate poverty and homelessness, as well as improve education opportunities and address the exploitation of children. We tithe corporate profits into the Apex Foundation to assist with this mission.

APEX FOUNDATION

It is our goal at Apex to continuously improve the world through the implementation of fiscally-responsible and environmentally-friendly projects. Plus, we actively work to improve the community around us and abroad by dedicating a portion of each year's profits to these causes. Half of Apex Foundation's assets are used to help in the local community. The other half of the assets are used globally to help fight poverty and injustice.

In 2020, Apex donated \$500.00 to nine local nonprofits in and around the twin cities. On top of the monetary donations Apex employees enjoy getting hands-on with the non-profits that we support and partner with. Unfortunately due to Covid and the restrictions that have been imposed on numerous businesses and organizations, our employees were not able to volunteer their time with our partner organizations in 2020.

Also due to Covid, and International travel restrictions, we were unable to complete our company paid trip to Haiti, where we partner with World Wide Village and serve alongside our Haitian brothers and sisters. While there we teach job skills, help construct homes, develop and plan agricultural and business programs, lead children's programs and build lasting relationships with the people and communities where we serve.

Apex did donate \$1,405 to WWV in 2020 to help a small village school in the mountains that our company has committed to supporting. This donation was on top of the monthly recurring donations that our employees have decided to donate out of thier pockets.
