## Annual Benefit Report of Healthy Share GBC

A Minnesota General Public Benefit Corporation

## March 17, 2021

Healthy Share GBC was incorporated in 2019 as a General Benefit Corporation with a Specific Public Benefit under Minnesota's Public Benefit Corporation Act (the "Act"). Pursuant to Section 304A.101 of the Act, Healthy Share GBC's public benefit purpose as stated in it's Articles of Incorporation is:

... to pursue a net material positive impact from the business and operations of a general benefit corporation on society, the environment, and the well-being of present and future generations. In addition to this general public benefit, Healthy Share GBC has elected to also pursue these goals:

- Developing economic opportunities for small, sustainable farmers and food producers
- Encouraging healthy eating patterns
- · Making healthy food easily available and affordable
- Creating living-wage jobs
- Decreasing the environmental impact of food production and distribution

Our Board of Directors has elected to continue to use the same third-party standard – B Impact Assessment, developed by B Lab – used in last year's Annual Benefit Report and has continued to apply this third-party standard in a manner consistent with the application of this third-party standard last year.

Healthy Share GBC pursued the specific benefit purpose stated in its articles of incorporation in the following ways:

This corporation's primary means of accomplishing its goals is by successfully implementing its year-round "Healthy Share" subscription service, which makes locally grown and organic food readily available and affordable, and provides fair prices to sustainable food producers.

The following is a description of how we believe we succeeded in achieving the goals of our specific public benefit purpose:

• Successfully completed the first 12 months of continuous service (one-year anniversary was in November 2020), providing weekly deliveries of fresh

produce that provides the variety recommended by the national Dietary Guidelines.

- Demonstrated that Minnesota consumers can adhere to the Dietary Guidelines while sourcing the majority of their food locally, despite the region's relatively short growing season; 59% of the food delivered to Healthy Share subscribers in 2020 was sourced from local farms.
- Created new economic opportunities for 25 small, sustainable food producers and a co-operatively owned organic food distributor.
- Encouraged healthy eating patterns by providing customers with the variety of fresh produce recommended by the national Dietary Guidelines.
- Formed a working relationship with the Prairie Island Indian Community to assist its members in expanding access to nutritious and indigenous foods, and in asserting greater sovereignty over its food supply.
- Joined a group of non-profits and public benefit corporations documenting energy conservation opportunities provided by local food systems, and assessing energy conservation opportunities that would arise from advancing similar food sovereignty efforts with Minnesota's other tribal communities.

The following is a description of what prevented us from achieving the specific public benefit purpose, to the extent we did not create the specific public benefit in this reporting year:

• While Healthy Share successfully expanded its subscription base in 2020 and entered into working relationships that will provide additional expansion, the corporation has not yet grown to the point where it is directly creating living-wage jobs. However, Healthy Share's business model continues to perform as expected, and the corporation remains committed to a \$15 minimum wage for employees. Job creation will only be possible by expansion of Healthy Share's subscription base; to that end Healthy Share GBC continues to refine its marketing and communications efforts to attract new subscribers in order to increase the corporation's positive impact on society and the environment.
