- Inform back pain sufferers about Inspired Spine's superior treatment options via awareness and education campaigns (digital and traditional media), increasing demand for this standard of care by 220% versus 2019;
- Recruit spine surgeons to learn the techniques and commence practicing and refining the corresponding protocols – seven (7) surgeons commenced training with two (2) surgeons achieving certification proficiency (currently 7 surgeons are Inspired Spine Certified, including the current Surgeon-Trainer, and 15 surgeons in various stages of training);
- Published eighth (8th) peer reviewed study on the clinical outcomes of Inspired Spine's surgical techniques to provide objective and quantitative evidence of this standard of care's superiority (evidence based medicine);
- Held 4 cadaver labs and other educational events to promote additional use of Inspired Spine Protocol by informing and educating additional non-certified physicians on the same.
