#### Revenue and Recognition

In response to the pandemic shutdown in March 2020, R&D LABS developed a concept model for treatment of upper respiratory infections by mechanically routing air passages in an attempt to reduce the replication rate of the pathogen(s).

A provisional patent was filed in May under a new company we named "RespirVent" and was presented live online to an investor audience.

There were additional presentations made to various organizations to try to get key physician opinion leaders to give an opinion on the core principals and function of our concept design with preliminary functional concept models.

\$300k of donated software was used to enhance and simplify the designs of parts that could be 3D printed or molded of medical-grade silicone.

R&D LABS continued providing support to an academic institution for their search and rescue robotics program.

#### Hinderances

The pandemic hindered our ability to prepare presentations for potential customers. The pandemic also hindered the ability to interface with medical professionals and key physician opinion leaders to validate our medical device concept.
