Attachment to 2024 Annual Benefit Report

Just Housing SBC, a Minnesota Public Benefit Corporation

This report covers activities from January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023.

The corporation undertook significant activities to pursue and create its stated public benefit: to enable and accelerate equitable and widespread adoption of sustainable solutions for housing; and remove barriers to individual and community needs for healthy, affordable, durable homes built to operate without burning fossil fuels.

Specific actions and activities we engaged in to create public benefit included the following:

- We updated our website, just-housing.com, adding educational and technical content
- We created designs and construction documents for two new cost-effective, zeroenergy capable prototype homes:
 - o Evergreen 24: a 1344 ft2 3 bedroom, 1 ½ bath single family home
 - Evergreen Duo: a two-story duplex, our first multi-family model
- Both new prototype homes are now available on our website.
- We revamped our standard details and specifications, created one set for Climate zone 6 and one set for Climate zone 7, to further optimize climate-specific, cost-effective energy efficient housing solutions in our region.
- Owner Rachel Wagner gave presentations/interviews promoting sustainable housing, clean-energy for buildings and equitable community development:
 - o February at the Energy Design Conference in Duluth, MN
 - March at the ENHABIT conference in Grand Rapids, MN
 - June a "Clean Energy Conversation," video with nonprofit Slipstream
- We met with staff and school board members of the Wrenshall School, to discuss ways we could assist their CTE (career and technical education) program to introduce students to green trades career pathways.
- We designed 3 posters to introduce green building to high school age students and others interested in the trades. We had the posters printed and delivered one set to the Wrenshall school to hang in their facility.
- Joined the MN Residential Code Advocates committee, at the invitation of Fresh Energy, to advise and support efforts for more stringent residential energy codes.
- Launched the Green New Deal Housing YouTube channel, hosting free educational videos about green building.
- Offered reduced rate services to three local nonprofits:
 - Green New Deal Housing: delivered training to carpenters in the Community Construction crew, a Community Action Duluth workforce training program
 - Green New Deal Housing: to design and deliver their Train the Trainers Project
 - o Family Rise Together: to design a new energy efficient home for unhoused men
 - Divine Konnections: to design a healthy, durable addition and renovation to their group home for teenage mothers

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- Gave public tours at the Evergreen Pilot Project, Green New Deal Housing's first zero energy home, designed by Just Housing
- Served on a panel at the Our Climate Futures conference at University MN Duluth
- Served on a panel at the Women in Energy conference in Minneapolis, hosted by Center for Energy and the Environment (CEE)
- Applied and was accepted for participation in the Univ of MN Institute on the Environment (IonE) undergraduate leaders program, to collaborate on a project and serve as a mentor to a student team.

The extent to which we believe we delivered public benefit includes the following:

- We welcomed Duluth residents, state legislators and staff, and local nonprofit staff to the Evergreen House, introducing and educating hundreds of Minnesota citizens about the need for resilient, all-electric housing available to all residents, regardless of income level; and the need for workforce training in green construction.
- We created new relationships with educators and tradespeople, growing interest and understanding of green building techniques and green job opportunities. These relationships are advancing awareness and access to healthier homes and better building practices, and wider opportunity in the building trades.
- The YouTube video channel for green building has more than 300 subscribers and more than 29,000 views of the content. There is a public benefit to widespread access to this information; viewers who see it can "be it."
- We delivered affordable design services to three community-based nonprofits, aiding their ability to provide healthy, durable, efficient housing to underserved citizens.
- We trained more than 30 experienced and incoming regional tradespeople in green building methods; their new skills will directly benefit them and their clients/students.

Circumstances that hindered efforts to pursue and/or create the public benefit:

- We submitted a proposal to the JMK Innovation Fund for funding to assist the development of designs and our organizational growth, but were not awarded funding.
- We are still not well known in the region, and have not yet had the opportunity to work
 with a developer who will build multiple homes from our designs. We look forward to
 delivering the public benefit of larger scale zero-energy housing development.
- Our own lack of capacity hindered our ability to pursue as much work as is needed to
 meet the needs and opportunities we see. We look forward to adding staff when we
 have the financial ability to do so, which will increase our capacity.
- We spent many hours spent pursuing a significant zero-energy housing project that might have stimulated dozens more similar projects. That project fell through.
