





Results certified by the State Canvassing Board on November 27, 2012.
 The Obama-Romney margin is the difference between the percent of total votes cast for Barack Obama and the percent of total votes cast for Mitt Romney in each precinct.
 For example, Obama received 52.65% and Romney received 44.95% of the total statewide vote, so that margin is 7.69%.
