



HOW CAN I HELP?

HELP EVERYONE STAY INFORMED

It's so important that every Minnesota voter has the right information about what their rights are, what the laws are, and how they can make their voice heard.

Share reliable resources from the Office of the Minnesota Secretary of State and local election officials. Minnesotans can visit mnvotes.gov to:

- ✓ Register to vote
- ✓ Check or update registration
- ✓ Find voting locations
- ✓ View a sample ballot
- ✓ Learn key election dates
- ✓ Get facts about Minnesota elections

To vote in Minnesota, you must be:

- ✓ A U.S. citizen
- ✓ At least 18 years old on Election Day
- ✓ A Minnesota resident for at least 20 days
- ✓ Not under a court order revoking your right to vote

The Office of the Minnesota Secretary of State also provides voting information and forms in 11 languages.

HELP SOMEONE VOTE

In Minnesota, voting starts as early as 46 days before an election. People who are eligible to vote can cast ballots by mail, early in-person at their local election office, or on Election Day.

Help someone check that their voter registration is up to date by visiting: mnvotes.gov/register

Would you or someone you know like to request an absentee ballot be mailed to your home? Apply securely online at: mnvotes.gov/absentee

GET INVOLVED IN THE PROCESS

Becoming an election judge (poll worker) is one of the best ways to contribute to Minnesota's world-class elections. Our democracy depends on thousands of Minnesotans who step up every year to work at the polling place on Election Day. It's a great way to see how elections work, meet your neighbors, and serve the community. Students as young as 16 years old may also apply to be trainee election judges. An eligible voter can serve as an election judge anywhere in Minnesota.
