




Results as certified by the State Canvassing Board on November 27, 2018.

The DFL-Republican margin is the difference between the percent of total votes cast for the DFL candidate and the percent of total votes cast for the Republican candidate in each precinct.

For example, in Heron Lake (1st Cong. Dist.), Dan Feehan (DFL) received 49.34% and Jim Hagedorn (Republican) received 49.78% of the vote, so that margin is .44%.
