

Second Annual Benefit Report Torrch, GBC

This Annual Benefit Report is made March 23, 2018 by Torrch GBC, a Minnesota General Benefit Corporation ("Torrch") to fulfill the reporting period of 1/1/2017 – 12/31/2017.

Although operations have not yet begun at Torrch, (we will launch torrch.com on April 1^{st} , 2018) we certify that:

- (1) Board of Directors Certification. The Board of Directors of Torrch hereby certifies that it has:
 - Chosen the third-party standard designated pursuant to the Minnesota Public Benefit Corporation Act, Section 304A.301, Subd. 3, clause (2), item (i);
 - II. Determined that the organization that promulgated the third-party standard, B Impact Assessment, is independent; and
 - III. Approved this report
- (2) Pursuit of General Public Benefit. Although Torrch, GBC, has not yet begun operations, Torrch has:
 - Designated B Lab's, specifically the B Impact Assessment, as its third-party standard; and
 - In keeping with the Third-Party Standard's focus on the importance of how a company sustains social impact through the community and its own business practices, Torrch has,
 - A. Changed its general public benefit to now feed starving children in third-world nations through three non-profit organizations. Those three non-profits are World Vision, Children's Hope Chest, and One Child Matters.
 - B. Created general public benefit by redesigning the web application that will allow people to find help and guidance with mental health issues by booking Christian counselors via the Torrch.com platform.
 - C. Faced circumstances that hindered efforts to pursue or create general public benefit, shifting the company's focus from connecting people with Christian service professionals to focusing connections only to Christian Counselors.
- (4) Third-Party Standard. Torrch has chosen to continue to use B Labs, specifically the B Impact Assessment, as its third-party standard.
 - This third part standard has continued to be applied in a manner consistent with our previous year's report.

(6) Public Benefit Purpose. We have stated that our public benefit purpose is to feed starving children in third world nations. However, we have not yet launched our platform, thus have not yet started public operations yet. We do plan to launch April 1, 2018.
