

As a result, Growers are trending toward more data-driven practices that give them better visibility to their growing environments to manage costly crop inputs more effectively. EarthScout® is a global company with Minnesota roots in the heartland of agriculture and our products are proudly manufactured in the USA. Our company is comprised of international experts who share a passion for helping growers to innovate through the use of timely data.

**Our Mission:** We are growers helping growers develop smart, industrial grade tools for gathering useful, grower owned data. We help growers optimize growth, reduce inputs, conserve resources and build living soils for a stronger, healthier future.

**Our Vision:** To create the world's premier community of science-minded growers dedicated to advancing living soils and sustainable agriculture via the most elegant and robust Internet of Things (IoT) platform that promotes collaboration, education and applied data analytics.

#### Our History:

- Design Ready Controls (DRC) is a manufacturer of electrical control panels and wire harnesses with 500
  employees; DRC builds over 50,000 panels and harnesses per year at locations in MN, OR, OK, and VA;
  DRC employs 50+ electrical, mechanical and computer engineers.
- In 2015 while looking for a new product brand, DRC started developing an Internet Of Things (IOT) device for the precision Ag market and EarthScout® was born a revolutionary technology for measuring real-time growing conditions, 24/7—above and below the ground. Sensors capture multiple data points in the soil and within the local growing environment giving up-to-the minute field information between zones. Data is wirelessly communicated back to the grower's smartphone or desktop computer through an intuitive interface.
- In 2017 DRC spun off EarthScout as a new company and deployed the first 15 EarthScout beta units.
- EarthScout was incorporated on December 19, 2019.

## We believe EarthScout was successful in achieving the goals as a Specific Benefit Corporation in the following ways:

- EarthScout is providing invaluable data to growers' real time educating them on ways they can more
  effectively manage and reduce costly inputs including insecticides, fertilizer, water, while maintaining
  soils that produce healthier plants, higher yields and a better environment.
- EarthScout can be configured for any grower, any crop, and any environment—including grains (corn, soybean, wheat, etc.), orchards, vineyards, fruits, vegetables, turf & landscape, nurseries, greenhouses, and specialty growers (hemp, hops, etc.).
- Over 180 EarthScout units have been deployed in MN, ND, SD, IA, WI and VT and 20 deployed outside
  US. The units are gathering real time data for our researchers and growers to analyze. EarthScout is
  working with the growers to continually enhance our products for mass production.
- EarthScout has over 20 sensors for measuring conditions above and below the ground, and additional sensors are currently under development in our lab.
- EarthScout has assembled a team of leading precision Ag experts to further develop analytical and predictive tools
