Annual Benefit Report of Hippy Feet GBC A Minnesota General Public Benefit Corporation

Hippy Feet GBC was incorporated on April 4th, 2017 as a General Benefit Corporation under Minnesota's Public Benefit Corporation Act (the "Act"). Pursuant to Section 304A.101 of the Act, Hippy Feet's general public benefit purpose as stated in it's Articles of Incorporation is "to pursue a net material positive impact from the business and operations of a general benefit corporation on society, the environment, and the well-being of present and future generations."

Throughout this report, Hippy Feet GBC will be referred to as Hippy Feet or may refer to itself as "we", or "our" or "us."

Our Board of Directors has selected the following independent third-party standard: Global Reporting Initiative

In accordance with this third-party standard, Hippy Feet has done the following to pursue a general public benefit:

Hippy Feet sells apparel and accessory products with a mission to serve young people experiencing homelessness. In 2021, the primary focus of our mission was providing a transitional employment program to young people ages 16-24 who are affected by homelessness and housing insecurity. In an effort to expand this program, we hired an employment program director with social work experience to administer the program and work hands on with clients. Program participants were able to earn a safe, legal form of income while getting access to job experience and training. We also connect participants with our non-profit partners, which provide supplemental resources like counseling, bus passes, and work clothing.

Hippy Feet has also maintained our commitment to making all of our products in the United States using eco-friendly materials whenever possible.

In accordance with this third-party standard, Hippy Feet has created the following general public benefit:

In 2021, Hippy Feet was able to provide 3,514 hours of transitional income opportunities to young people ages 16-24 who are impacted by homelessness and housing instability. In addition to our employment program, Hippy Feet was able to save nearly 14.6 million gallons of water by using recycled materials and avoiding the use of new-growth cotton in our products, as well as divert 6,097 pounds of cotton from landfills.

The following circumstances hindered Hippy Feet's efforts to pursue or create a general public benefit:

Increased cost pressures on advertising, raw materials, and energy have all strained our ability to grow and therefore scale our social benefit in 2021.

Our board of directors has elected to continue to use the same third-party standard used in last year's Annual Benefit Report and has continued to apply this third-party standard in a manner consistent with the application of this third-party standard last year.
