Quality Bicycle Products, GBC, hereby referred to as "QBP" is filing this annual report pursuant to MN Statue 304A.301. QBP's board certifies:

- QBP has selected B-Lab's Impact Assessment as its independent third-party standard and determined that this organization that promulgated the third-party standard is independent.
- Approval of the annual report

With regard to the period covered by the annual report:

- The identity of the third-party standard determined by the Board is B Impact Assessment, which is provided by B Lab, 15 Waterloo Ave Berwyn, PA 19312
- With reference to that third-party standard, QBP provided general public benefit in the following ways. We call these our B Impact Areas:
 - Governance- Be an extraordinary business
 - Workers- Be a Great Place to Work
 - Customers- Deliver Compelling Brands and Products
 - Environment- Practice Environmental and Supply Chain Responsibility
 - Community- Contribute to and "Bikeify" our Community

The extent to which and the ways in which QBP created general public benefit for the reporting years is as follows:

- Workers- Be a Great Place to Work
 - Employee ride incentives
 - Weekend shifts implemented for those who prefer. Pay differential offered to those who do these shifts.



- Opportunities for employees to travel and work at different DCs
- Very low overtime for the year- 3.5% of our labor
- Employee safety- A 50% reduction in worker's comp claims from 2020 to 2021
- OSHA injury rating decrease by 75% from 2020 to 2021
- Proactive Covid Response Team
- Introduction of DEI chats and the opportunity to be a part of 17 different employee support groups.
- Leadership Education Series focused on DEI. Included four 3-hour trainings.
- Customers- Deliver Compelling Brands and Products
 - Align, invest, and grow our proprietary P&A brands
- Environment- Practice Environmental and Supply Chain Responsibility
 - E-Bike battery recycling program implemented with fellow bike industry companies
 - Solar energy production on all owned distribution centers
 - Implemented employee carbon offset program
 - Restricted Substance List created and shared with Tier 1 suppliers
 - 2.3M miles avoided by remote work
 - Bike/apparel packaging reduction with a goal of 50% less poly bags in DC packaging by 2024
- o Community- Contribute to and "Bikeify" our Community
 - Community Grants totaling over \$255k in 4 years which put an emphasis on disinvested communities. Goal of \$150k in grants for 2022 and \$1M goal in next 10 years
 - Have donated \$10M to bicycle non-profits since 1998
 - League Cycling Instructor scholarship classes. We are fully funding 4 classes throughout the US.
 - World Bicycle Relief School Adoption
 - Funding of Youth Cycling Coalition
