To date these clinicians have recorded over 110,000 patients

and logged 325,000 visits, with a 35% return visit rate. Ongoing healthcare for these individuals will be improved with access to past medical histories and the ability for clinicians to track referrals and follow-ups needed.

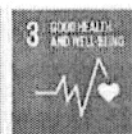
Additionally this information will be collated with other health data tracking to better distribute limited medical supplies.

### PERMANENT HEALTH CENTERS

The pandemic slowed down both foreign and local traveling medical teams serving rural communities. Our team switched focus to provide virtual care, but also began to build features for the permanent clinics who were still operating. These local health centers have very similar technical limitations as mobile clinics – low access to electricity and internet services. This allowed us to help even more beneficiaries in rural communities through improved services, more accurate data collection, less time spent on paper tracking, better reporting data on health issues and outbreaks, and advanced care with remote patient chart reviews by specialists.

## IMPACT MEASUREMENT

Ecotone Analytics created an Impact Measurement report for Binary Bridge, and we are able to show that for every \$1 invested in Binary Bridge, BackpackEMR provides \$6 of Social Return On Investment (SROI). We'll continue to measure our impact as we grow to further refine and validate those numbers.

Social Return on Investment (SROI)

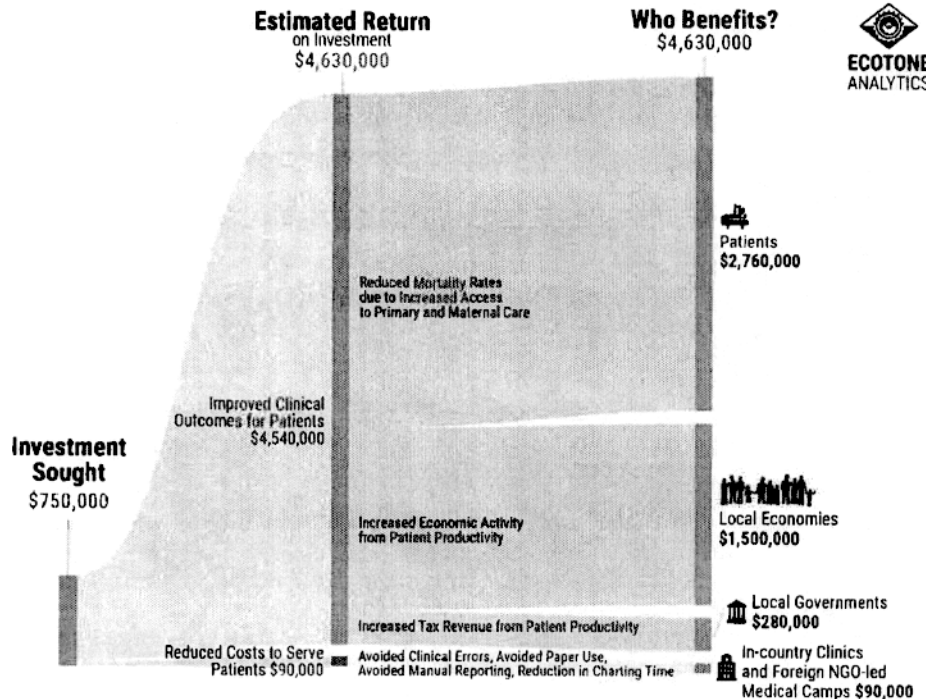
